Bryn Mawr Hospital project delivers improvements even better than previously planned:

Meet our new addition—a seven-story Patient Pavilion

Dear Friends,

At this time of year, when families gather together to give thanks and celebrate a season of holidays, we are reminded of the blessings children bring to this world. Whether ushering in the birth of a healthy new baby or caring for our youngest and most vulnerable patients, the full spectrum of maternity and neonatal services at Bryn Mawr Hospital is vital to our community.

Do you know a Bryn Mawr baby? Thousands of children, seniors and everyone in between pass by our iconic campus and are reminded of the special connection they hold with this community institution. For more than a century, Bryn Mawr Hospital has been the trusted resource for expectant families in this region. In return, we have, time and time again, invested in our maternity services and facilities to offer a superior experience.

Approved in late 2014, the \$200 million Bryn Mawr Hospital Campus Modernization Project sought to address the core components of our community hospital and raise the level of our facilities to meet the excellence of our caregiving teams. The project scope included construction of a five-story Patient Pavilion, to house all new surgical

facilities; a critical care unit and two inpatient floors; and renovations to the Hospital's existing postpartum maternity unit, outpatient services department and public spaces.

As teams of architects and designers have advanced the plans over the past year, we recognized the pressing need for more comprehensive improvements to our maternity and neonatal facilities.

With the unanimous support of the Main Line Health Board of Governors, we have expanded the scope of our modernization project and the size of the Patient Pavilion to include two additional floors, providing the families in this community with access to all-new Labor & Delivery, Postpartum Maternity and Neonatal Intensive Care Units.

The new and improved Campus Modernization Project continues to be supported by the *FOR EVERY GENERATION* capital campaign—the name of which rings truer now more than ever. These

improvements will enhance the experience of patients from every generation, for generations to come.

We hope you share our excitement for this new addition to the modernization project. In approximately two years, families in this region will have access to a superior physical environment that better supports the heartwarming moments of new life and the care of each new member of the Bryn Mawr Hospital family.

- Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) with capacity for 15 babies
